PAUL REPEATS HIMSELF WITH AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE.

"The joy of the Lord will arm us against the assaults of our spiritual enemies, and put our mouths out of taste for those pleasures with which the tempter baits his hooks." Matthew Henry

- A. Choose joy in spite of circumstances.
- B. Joy is **based** on the Lord.
 - 1. Repetition of Truth is a good thing.
 - 2. Repetition of Truth can bring fresh meaning.
 - 3. Repetition of Truth keeps us from **cultural** thinking.

PAUL ISSUES A WARNING.

- A. He describes those who are **perverting** Truth.
 - 1. Through cultural thinking
 - 2. Through immoral character
 - 3. Through legalism
- B. He describes a true heart.
 - 1. Through empowered worship
 - 2. Through praise of Jesus Christ
 - 3. Through the <u>realization</u> that we cannot <u>save</u> ourselves
- C. He uses himself as an illustration.
 - 1. It is not through going through <u>rituals</u>
 - 2. It is not through family pedigree
 - 3. It is not through our own efforts

PAUL PRESENTS A STRONG CONCLUSION.

- A. EVERYTHING is loss compared to a **relationship** with Jesus.
 - 1. Human accomplishments fade
 - 2. Jesus illuminates
- B. EVERYTHING is gained in a **relationship** with Jesus.
 - 1. Jesus is in control.
 - a. A knowledge of Christ Jesus.
 - b. Lord **ownership**, authority
 - 2. Earthly values fade.
 - 3. Heavenly values emerge.
- C. EVERYTHING becomes <u>new</u> through the fellowship with Jesus.
 - 1. Knowing Jesus
 - 2. Knowing resurrection power
 - a. Emptying me of <u>me</u>
 - b. Filling me with Him
