- A. Finally the good **guys** are **winning**!
- B. What is our time perspective?
 - 1. Our time is objectively measured.
 - 2. Our time is tangible.
 - 3. Our time is rarely ignored.
- C. What is God's time perspective?
 - 1. His time is without boundaries.
 - 2. His time is immeasurable.
 - 3. His time is **absolutely intangible**.

- A. Is He silent?
 - 1. Yes, there are times He is silent.
 - 2. Yes, He is silently working.
- B. Understanding God's silence

"Has God trusted you with His silence – a silence that has great meaning? God's silences are actually His answer."

Oswald Chambers

- 1. **Consider** what God is **saving**.
- 2. Watch for subtle changes.
- 3. **Prepare** for dramatic **change**.
- 4. **Expect** a surprise **ending**.
- C. How do we cope with God's silence?

"A wonderful thing about God's silence is that His stillness is contagious – it gets into you, causing you to become perfectly confident so that you can honestly say, "I know that God has heard me."

- Realize the silent period is neither accidental nor fatal.
- 2. **Remember** that God's workings are **unrelated** to our limited **perspectives**.
- 3. <u>Remind</u> ourselves that there are no <u>coincidences</u> in life.

 - 2. She does not **manipulate**.
 - 3. She uses her **tongue** wisely.
