THE SECOND SET OF PETITIONS HAVE TO DO WITH OUR NEEDS.

- A. The inclusiveness of the petitions
- B. The order of the petitions
 - 1. Our **physical** needs
 - 2. Our spiritual needs

THE FIRST PETITION: GIVE US OUR DAILY BREAD

- A. Our bread includes all our natural needs.
- B. The Almighty God cares for ALL our needs.
- "...He Whose eye encompasses in its boundless reach the first day of creation and the last hour of judgment, reflecting all the eternities; He whose outstretched arm enfolds the oceans, islands, and continents, because all authority in Heaven and earth has been given Him, He occupies Himself with the trivialities of humankind..."

- 1. God is the Creator and Sustainer of the **universe**.
- 2. God desires to care for OUR needs.
- C. We must pray for our necessities.
- D. If God knows my needs, why pray?
 - 1. Prayer is **communication**.
 - 2. God desires to hear our petitions.

E. We must realize our utter dependence on God.

THE SECOND PETITION: FORGIVE OUR DEBTS AS WE FORGIVE OUR DEBTORS

- A. We can pray to be forgiven.
- B. A forgiving spirit comes from being forgiven.
- C. Forgiveness comes when we forgive.

He doesn't say that we are to forgive other people's sins provided they are not too frightful, or provided there are extenuating circumstances, or anything of that sort. THE THIRD PETITION: LEAD US NOT INTO TEMPTATION BUT DELIVER US FROM EVIL

- A. We are asking to be spared temptation that we can't withstand.
- B. We are asking to be delivered from evil.
 - 1. The evil one.
 - 2. The evil in our hearts.
 - 3. The evil in the world.
- C. Why should we pray this petition?
